Update on American Solar Energy Society's (ASES) ***Green Jobs Report***

ASES's *Green Collar Jobs in the U.S. and Colorado* report was prepared in January 2009. It provides a sector-by-sector analysis of where the opportunities are in the rapidly changing renewable energy and energy efficiency industries. It reported that these industries represented more than 9 million jobs in 2007 and is growing three times as fast as the U.S. Economy.
